# Kids Ministry & Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Update

We offer two levels of The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd method of Faith Formation for children. Level 1, which is located across from the gift shop in the church building, is for children ages 3–6. Level 2 is currently located in the FLC and is for children ages 7–9. The catechists who work with the children participate in over 100 hours of formation and prepare a special environment for the children, which is called the Atrium.

Why is it called an Atrium anyway? The word atrium actually means "portico, or porch entrance to a large house". The Atrium was a term given to this space by Maria Montessori. It was chosen because in the ancient church, the atrium was a gathering space between the Church Proper and the street. It was a place where the catechumens, those preparing for initiation to the Church, would receive introduction. The Atrium has a similar purpose for our children, as it is a place to help them enter into full, conscious, and active participation in the liturgical and communal life of the Church.

Recently in the level 1 Atrium, the children have celebrated Christmas and Epiphany: We have proclaimed from the Bible (Matthew 2:1-12) the Visitation of the Magi, referring to our maps to elevate the reality of this event, God places a sign of nature to announce Jesus' birth. The magi search for him and offer mysterious gifts as clues to his identity: Gold (for his kingship); Frankincense (because he is God); and Myrrh (because he is human, like us). This stirs wonder in the children as to the identify of Jesus through these gifts given to a small child. ("Are these good gifts for a baby?! What can these gifts tell us about the baby? I wonder what Mary will do with these gifts.") The magi offer a model for us in how to respond to Jesus, and we think about the slow, hidden way God brings great things through small beginnings. In the Level 2 Atrium with older children, we also have had a Christmas and Epiphany celebration and have presented a synthesis of the infancy narratives in which we take a closer look at the events, just before and after Jesus's birth, to discover in their recurrent themes a unity of the events which bind them together. Thus far, we have looked at synthesis themes of "prayer" and "names". In both atria, the children are provided with materials (dioramas of Mary's house; Elizabeth's house; figures of the magi, Mary, baby Jesus, the manger, etc.; scripture books, etc.) for them to return to and work with as they ponder the events that have taken place.

With children in other Faith Formation groups, we have covered many of the same historical infancy narratives and have discussed Jesus's public ministry, the apostles, the beatitudes and will begin to explore Jesus's parables." We appreciate catechists Karla Agurcia, Kim Derdock, Suzie and John Person, Trish Robertson, Patricia Smith, and Amanda Stratman who devote their time and talents; and who give love and care to the children of our parish.
